NNMC COVID Policy

- Northern NM College is committed to a safe and healthy workplace. To that end, our vaccination policy is still in place for our staff, faculty, and students, and we encourage booster shots. Although COVID-related hospitalizations and deaths have declined, the Omicron variants are still present in our community.
- Masks are optional but strongly encouraged. Masking helps us all stay safer and shows kindness to others, especially those more vulnerable. Those hosting events should have masks available.
- As a guest to our campus, please be aware of our vaccination policies, sign in when you enter our buildings, and adhere to our temperature check procedures.
- We have posted a symptoms checklist at our entrances and ask that if you confirm any of these, please do not enter our buildings or participate in public events.





How to determine "Close Contact"

CDC guidance for children and adults in indoor and outdoor settings (excluding K-12 school settings):

- Were you less than 6 feet away from someone with confirmed or suspected COVID-19?
- Have you been in the presence of someone with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period? Include the period 2 days before the infected person developed symptoms or the date they were tested if they do not have symptoms.
- If the answers to the questions above are both yes, you have had a close contact, regardless of whether the person was wearing a mask properly.
- If the answer to either of the questions above is no, you have not had a close contact.





CDC Recommendations for Unvaccinated Close Contacts

- If you are not fully vaccinated and boosted, you need to quarantine for at least five (5) days from the date of last close contact.
- You should wear a well-fitting mask when around others for 10 days from the date of the last close contact with someone with COVID-19.
- If you do not have COVID-19 symptoms, you should watch for symptoms for 10 days and get tested at least five (5) days after the close contact.
- If you test positive, continue to isolate per CDC guidelines.





CDC Recommendations for Vaccinated Close Contacts

- If you have taken the full series of recommended COVID-19 vaccines and boosters, you do not need to quarantine but should get tested at least five (5) days after close contact.
- Watch for symptoms and wear a well-fitting mask while around other people for 10 days from the date of last close contact.
- If you develop symptoms, you should isolate and get tested immediately. If you test positive, you should continue to isolate per CDC guidelines.
- If you had a prior infection in the past 90 days and have symptoms, you should isolate immediately and get tested.
