

2022 Graduating Students Survey

INTRODUCTION:

Northern New Mexico College is conducting a survey to gather information on graduating students' satisfaction and their education experiences at Northern New Mexico College every year. To continue this, the IR team of Northern administered this survey via Survey Monkey to all 2022 graduating students. A total of 242 students received the survey by email between April 26, 2022, and May 13, 2022. Ninety-three students responded giving 38% response rate.

The results are as follows:

Students provided responses regarding their satisfaction with various services provided by Northern. Very Satisfied and Satisfied options were grouped as Strengths and Dissatisfied and Very Dissatisfied were grouped as Areas for Improvement.

Strengths:

Graduates who completed the survey identified the top strengths as: The quality of instruction in your major (91%), Quality of academic advising (86%), College experience (85%), Quality of instructor outside of your major (84%).



Areas for Improvement:

Graduates who completed the survey identified the top opportunities for improvement as: The adequacy of financial assistance received (10%), Quality of academic advising (9%), Contacting with faculty outside of class received (8%), and Sense of community (7%).



STUDENT INFORMATION

Program Area of Study

Seventy-four (74) students responded to the question asked for the Award they received. Fifty-one percent (51%) indicated they received Bachelor's degree, thirty percent (30%) an associate's, eleven percent (11%) a certificate, four percent (4%) an ALP, and four percent (4%) more than one degree.

Out of these 74 students who responded to this question, forty-five percent (45%) were from Business Administration department, twenty-two percent (22%) from Education, twelve percent (12%) from Biology, Chemistry and ES, Nine percent (9%) from Arts, Film & Media, and Humanities & Social Science, five percent (5%) from Nursing and HS, four percent (4%) from Engineering and Tech, and three percent (3%) from Language and Letters.

Attend to Northern New Mexico College again?

Out of seventy-seven responded to this question, ninety-four percent (94%) responded, they would attend NNMC again and 6% would not attend.

Choose the same major?

Out of these 77 students, eighty-seven (87%) would choose the same major, and rest would choose different majors.

What is next?

Graduate School: Out of 22 who would like to go the graduate school, forty-five percent (45%) indicated they would go to Northern New Mexico College, twenty-three percent (23%) indicated University of New Mexico, eighteen percent (18%) indicated Highlands University, nine percent (9%) indicated Texas A&M, and five percent (5%) indicated University of Arizona School of Law.

Seek Job: Top three places where graduates look for the job were: Los Alamos National Lab (41%), Santa Fe Public School (5%), and Continue Current job (5%)

Already have job in the same field: Twenty-four students selected this option. Top three places where students have already job were: Los Alamos National Lab (42%), Teacher (8%), and Pojoaque (4%).

Teacher (K-12): Ten students out of 93 selected they would look for job as Teacher (K-12) around NNMC.

Another field: Four out of 93 students who participated in the survey responded that they would look for the job in another field different than that they graduated from.

Stay in New Mexico after graduation?

Out of 78 students who responded to this question, 95% indicated they would stay in New Mexico College and rest would not.
